A Waiting Season Devotional

Trusting God in the In-Between

The 6Eleven Life

Author's Note

If you are reading this, there is a good chance you are in a season of waiting, for clarity, for direction, for provision, for healing, or for a promise you believed God spoke but haven't yet seen fulfilled.

Waiting seasons can feel confusing and lonely. They can make us question ourselves, our faith, and sometimes even God. I know that tension well.

This devotional was written as a quiet companion for those in-between moments; not to rush you toward answers, but to remind you that God is present even here. That He is still working, still forming, still faithful, even when life feels paused.

You don't need to read this perfectly or follow it rigidly. Take it slowly. Sit with the words that resonate. Return to the days you need most.

My prayer is that these pages help you rest, trust, and rediscover hope, not because circumstances change immediately, but because you remember who God is while you wait.

You are not forgotten. And this season is not wasted.

A Note Before You Begin....

Waiting is one of the hardest invitations of faith. It stretches patience, exposes fear, and tests trust.

In seasons where answers feel delayed and direction feels unclear, waiting can feel like standing still or worse, being forgotten.

But Scripture offers a deeper truth: waiting is not wasted time. It is sacred space where God often does His quietest and most formative work.

“Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength.” – Isaiah 40:31

This devotional is written for the in-between season, when you are believing, hoping, and trusting, even when clarity has not yet arrived.

Take a moment. Breathe. God is here.

Day 1: When Waiting Feels Like Standing Still

Scripture:

“Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.” – Psalm 27:14

Waiting can feel like weakness in a world that rewards speed and progress. Yet biblical waiting is not passive. It is an active choice to trust God’s timing even when movement feels slow.

Strength in waiting is not found in striving harder, but in remaining anchored — choosing faith when circumstances tempt discouragement.

Prayer:

God, help me wait with courage rather than resentment. Teach me to trust You even when I feel still.

Day 2: God Is Working Even When You Can't See It

Scripture:

"Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how." – Mark 4:26–27

Some of God's most important work happens beneath the surface.

Waiting seasons often feel quiet, but quiet does not mean inactive. Growth is happening, roots are forming, faith is strengthening, and character is being refined.

What feels like delay may actually be preparation.

Prayer:

Lord, help me trust that You are at work even when I can't see evidence yet.

Day 3: Releasing the Need for Control

Scripture

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.” – Proverbs 3:5

Waiting reveals how deeply we rely on control for peace.

When outcomes remain uncertain, God invites us to loosen our grip not because He is distant, but because He is faithful.

Trust grows when we stop demanding full understanding and begin resting in His wisdom.

Prayer:

God, I release what I cannot manage. Teach me to trust You beyond my understanding.

Day 4: Faithfulness Without Visibility

Scripture

“Your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.” – Matthew 6:4

Waiting often removes recognition.

There may be no applause, affirmation, or visible progress but only quiet obedience.

Yet God sees every faithful step taken in hidden seasons. Nothing done in faith goes unnoticed.

Prayer:

Father, help me remain faithful even when no one else sees. Let my obedience be enough.



Day 5: Learning to Rest While You Wait

Scripture

“Be still and know that I am God.” – Psalm 46:10

Waiting does not require constant striving.

God invites us into stillness, not as inactivity, but as trust.

Resting while we wait is an act of faith that declares God is working even when we pause.

Prayer:

God, teach me to rest without guilt. Help me trust You with what remains unfinished.

Day 6: Trusting God's Timing

Scripture

*"He has made everything beautiful in its time."
— Ecclesiastes 3:11*

God's timing is intentional.

Waiting often protects us from stepping ahead too soon, from carrying what we are not yet ready to steward, and from outcomes that could harm rather than help.

God's delays are not denials; they are direction.

Prayer:

Lord, align my heart with Your timing. Help me wait without fear or frustration.

Day 7: Hope That Anchors the Wait

Scripture

“Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love.” – Lamentations 3:31–32

Waiting does not mean God has withdrawn His love.

Hope anchors us when answers remain unclear.

Even in uncertainty, God’s compassion remains constant, and His faithfulness does not depend on our timeline.

Prayer:

God, renew my hope. Help me trust You fully – even here.

Closing Reflection: When the Waiting Continues

This devotional may end, but your waiting season may not and that is okay.

God does not waste the in-between. He forms, strengthens, and prepares us there.

If you find yourself still waiting, return to these truths: God is present. God is working. God is faithful.

You are not forgotten and the story is not over.
